Tribute to Yanno

Long time Great Northern Brewers Club (GNBC) member Dave Yanoshek passed away in a boating accident last month. Dave was well known not only in our tight brewing circle and his death sent a shock wave across the community and state of Alaska as well.

Dave was one of the longest standing GNBC members in the history of our organization. Dave was often the first person people encountered when they were new to GNBC. How could anyone miss him? It wasn't so much his portly stature but his immense, often spirited personality that drew people in. His presence was often announced by his signature belly laugh, a sound that will echo in our hearts and in our club forever.

It only took a couple of beers at any GNBC event for the Viking in Dave to come out. This always hinted at his adventurous spirit that was invested not only in the club but through scouting, his kids, his work and his countless friends. More than once I've seen Dave adorn a

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Viking hat at a party and it always seemed so fitting. It went perfectly with his often wild red hair and scruffy beard. The effect was even better when I thrust a mead-filled pewter mug over his head and let out a good Viking howl.

I got to know Dave especially well during my tenure as GNBC Club President in 1992 and 1993, if memory serves me correctly. Dave was on our board of directors at that time. When running the club became especially frustrating and I really wanted to throttle someone, it was always Dave that stepped in with his even-keel balance and understanding, yet firm resolve to make things right. Without Dave, I'd have certainly made a bigger mess of the Club than I managed to in my short tenure. It always seemed to be his gentle hand that prodded the club back on course in its formative years.

Many of us gathered at Yanno's funeral and Celebration of Life, and again at a more beer-oriented event at Café Amsterdam. It was at that time that Midnight Sun Brewing Company (MSBC) decided to brew a commemorative beer to honor this great man. On Friday, August 01, MSBC brewer Gabe Fletcher produced The Viking, a Belgian dark strong ale. The Viking was made with traditional Belgian ingredients. Star anise and raisins promise to make the beer even more rich and complex.



"The style came from talking to his friends," said Fletcher. I knew he was a stout guy, but we didn't want to do a stout and knew that after his trip to Belgium, he'd learned to really enjoy the darker, stronger Belgian ales. We also wanted to brew something big that would lay down for sever years so that you could take it out later and do a little toast to him."

This is why although the brewery may lay only a couple of kegs down in the hold for release at very special events and locations sometime in the future, the objective was to brew 225 cases of bottle stock, sell it and donate all of the profit to Dave's surviving family. With that in mind, plan on attending Yanno Day at the brewery on Saturday, September 13th from Noon until 6 pm. More will be announced about this event as it unfolds, but plan on supporting this worthy cause by stopping by and picking up a case (or five) that day.

Although the brewery will sell individual bottles on September 13th, if you absolutely, positively can't make the gig, you can call the brewery and reserve a minimum of one case. The brewery understands that people will be out of town and want to get their share, and they understand that this stuff will probably fly

out the door, but keeping the lower limit at a case reduces administrative strain and ensures that the family gets the proceeds quickly. So, here's to Dave who represents the Viking in all of us!
