

This year's 2008 GNBC/Humpy's Great Alaskan Alehouse Annual Golf Tournament tees off at 7:00 am sharp with a shotgun start on Saturday, July 26th at the Moose Run Golf Course.

The tournament is open to anyone, although we'd prefer to fill the course with reveling GNBC club members and staff, affiliates and customers of Humpy's, our co-sponsor. This is your call to hurry and organize a team and be a part of it all.

Your entry fee will buy you the course and the game, of course, but for an extra couple of bucks, you can game the system with mulligans and other extras that might make up for beer-induced inaccuracies on the course. Prizes will be awarded for the best score, longest drive and the ball closest to the pin. Oh, and my husband, Dr. Fermento, won't let me forget, there's plenty of beer

that's served on the course by rotating beer carts and at special holes that feature special beer and events from our gracious distributors that help make the whole thing a resounding success.

Even if you don't golf (Fermento only shows up to proudly drink and drive the golf cart), I need your help. There's plenty of opportunity to help sign people in before tee-off, help with the barbeque, organize prizes, and generally make sure everything runs as smoothly as possible for the golfers. I especially need help now in the organizing stages. It takes a lot to harness the collective horsepower of the hospitality industry to create a lot of smiling golfers when everything comes to fruition on golf day.

Last year, between the proceeds of the game and additional gracious donations by Humpy's, we were able to purchase and put in place a beautiful golf cart designed to accommodate handicapped people on the course. Prior to the donation, a single, cantankerous cart was shared with the golf courses around town and had to be ferried

between to allow challenged folks to enjoy the day and the game. This year, the proceeds are being donated to Operation Denali 2009, the mission of which is to "Enable four warriors wounded in the global war on terrorism to overcome devastating combat injuries and successfully summit 20,320 foot Denali, the highest mountain in North America, symbolizing the strength of our nation and those who defend it." Grilling and fishing: Yep, that right! It's time for the GNBC July Picnic!!!



Jeff's back yard opens to a lake with paddle boats and a recreation area where volleyball, horseshoes, fishing and expansive views are the norm.
