This is due to the fact that Café A is now open on Sundays, so we will work around their schedule. Entries will be accepted at Arctic Brewing Supply on Friday the 7th from 11:00 until closing. Do Not, I repeat Do Not show up at Café A to drop off your entries on Friday or Saturday. The good folks working there are busy enough serving awesome food and beer.

There will be no entry fee and all categories are open. What you'll need is three 12 ounce bottles, preferably in brown glass with a completed entry form.
